Improving access and inclusion at our parks and reserves



Bardon Park has had an upgrade, with a new wheelchair-accessible swing now installed at the popular Maylands playground.

The upgrade has also included accessible pathways, an ACROD parking bay, new landscaping, a bike rack, an A-frame swing, updated basket swing and rubber soft fall surfacing.

The works were funded through cash-in-lieu contributions and support the City's Access and Inclusion Plan, which aims to make our public spaces more inclusive and accessible for all.

The changerooms at Upper Hillcrest Reserve in Bayswater have also been upgraded with new gender inclusive and accessible facilities.

The project converted two original changerooms into four refurbished rooms with private showers, individual changing spaces, bench seating, LED sensor lighting, and regular and ambulant toilets. The upgrade also included wheelchair ramps, grab rails and two new ACROD parking bays.

These improvements replace older infrastructure designed for male teams and provide more welcoming facilities that support greater participation in local sport, including the growing women's team at Bayswater Football Club.

Bayswater charges ahead, reaching 100% renewable electricity target

The City is proud to have achieved its 2025 target of 100% renewable electricity for City operations (excluding streetlighting), as part of its Emission Reduction and Renewable Energy Plan.

Endorsed by Council in 2021, the Plan sets out a roadmap for actions the City will take to achieve its targets, including net zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2040.

To reduce energy demand and cost, the City has implemented a number of initiatives, including entering into power purchasing agreements and installing solar panels.

In a WA first, the City entered into a contract with Synergy and WALGA to receive 100% green energy for 38 of its sites, delivering significant savings.

The greenhouse gas emissions saved so far equates to:



812 return flights between Perth and London



Average yearly emissions of 350 Australian households



Planting 105,000 trees

Building on this success, the City has re-signed a contract with WALGA and Synergy for the supply of renewable electricity for another three years.

Art that brings our streets to life: new murals pop up across the City

Just For Me Beauty, Bayswater

Just For Me Beauty Salon is blooming with a fresh new look made possible through the City's Placemaking Grants program.

A striking Australian native-inspired mural by local artist Olive Cheng Art is turning heads and sparking interest.

Owner Kristy Collins said the artwork has made the salon more noticeable and helped it stand out along King William Street.

Silly Goose Café, Maylands

Thanks to the City's Placemaking Grants program, Maylands' Silly Goose Café has had a refresh, including a new kids' area, landscaping and a striking mural.

The geese mural by local artist Happy Crow has become a popular selfie spot – a great backdrop while grabbing a coffee before heading to Maylands train station.

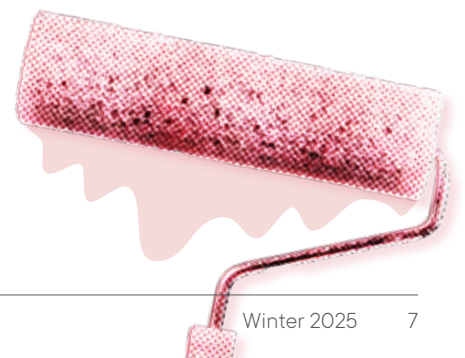
Meddy, along with her husband and her brother, opened Silly Goose just over a year ago, creating a welcoming space for the community to enjoy.

Galleria Shopping Centre

A vibrant new mural by Whadjuk/Ballardong Nyoongar and Eastern Arrernte artist Jade Dolman has transformed the exterior of Galleria Shopping Centre, brightening the stretch along Bishop and Russell Streets outside Kmart.

The artwork celebrates local flora, fauna and the significance of Country, using warm tones to represent land (Boodjar) and cool colours for water (Kep).

As part of the project, Jade ran workshops with students from Hampton Senior High School, helping bring the mural to life while sharing knowledge of local Noongar culture. The project was delivered in partnership with Vicinity Centres and the City.

Kaarla Kaatijin means to 'understand fire' in Noongar language.

Come on a journey into the lives of Djitty Djitty (Willy Wagtail), Kulbardi (Magpie), Dwert (Dingo) and more friends as they explore the importance of Kaarla (Fire).

Drawing from creation stories in and around Boorloo metropolitan area, playwright Zac James draws on traditional knowledge and storytelling to introduce young audiences to stories about fire in an authentic and engaging way.

Kaarla Kaatijin explores the importance of fire, spiritually and practically, using Noongar Dreaming stories and language, puppetry, masks and music, as young children experience stories in an engaging and joyful way.

Yirra Yaakin Theatre Company's much-loved Kaatijin Series introduces audiences to caring for country, environmental sustainability, cultural awareness and what it means to be a strong, centred individual learning about the world.

Bayswater placenames decoded through First Nations community project

The City has collaborated with Community Arts Network and Moodjar on a project to decode five locations.

The Place Names Bayswater project aimed to uncover and preserve the meanings of Noongar placenames within the City, with five sites decoded including Birralyn (Bayswater foreshore), Malgamongup (Bardon Park), Moorordup (Maylands train station), Nyurrdup (Bayswater train station) and Woorat (Maylands foreshore).

Traditional Owners, Noongar Elders and community knowledge holders living in or connected to Bayswater took part in cultural mapping workshops to explore the meanings of the decoded placenames.

Workshop participants then collaborated on a series of artworks that reflect the five locations, their cultural significance and the meanings of their placenames.

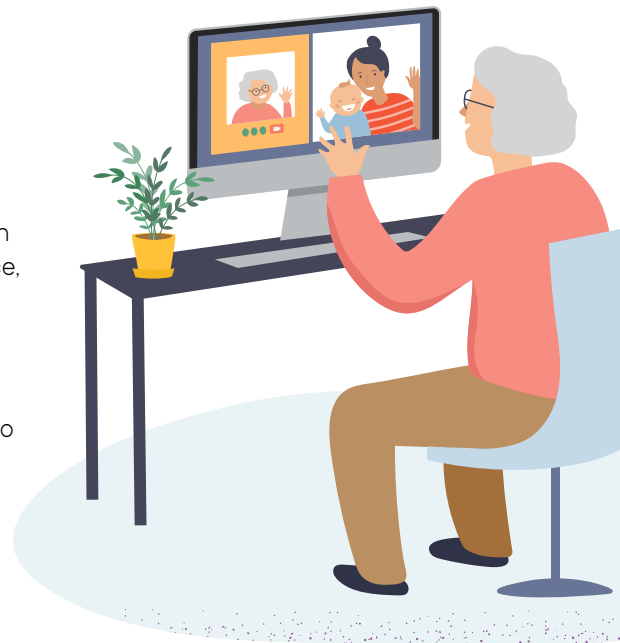

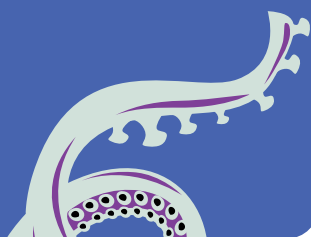

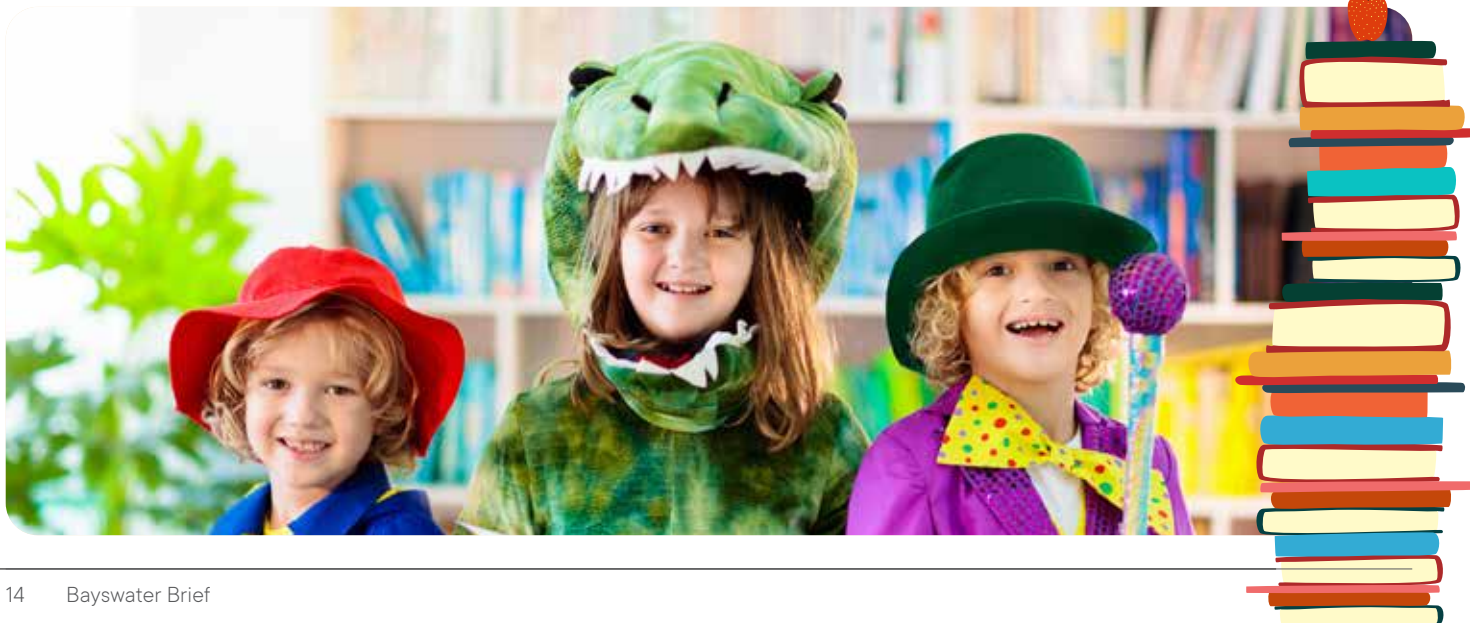
