New Council at City of Bayswater

The City's new Councillors have been officially sworn in, following the 2025 local government elections in October.

The City welcomes new Councillors Calla Loiacono for Central Ward, Anthony Pittaway for North Ward, and Donovan MacDonald and Cale Black for West Ward, in addition to re-elected Councillor Elli Petersen-Pik for South Ward.

Cr Petersen-Pik will serve as Deputy Mayor for another two years, following his term as Deputy Mayor from 2023 to 2025.

The newly elected Councillors will each serve a 4-year term until 2029, except for Cr Cale Black who will serve a 2-year term until 2027.

The City thanks outgoing Councillors Josh Eveson, Sally Palmer, Giorgia Johnson and Assunta Meleca for the time they spent serving the community, and acknowledges Councillors Dan Bull and Lorna Clarke who resigned during their terms to take up new positions in State Government.

Summer Energy Tips

Shade your home

- Close windows, curtains, blinds and doors during the hottest part of the day to block sunlight from entering your home.
- Shade east- and west-facing windows with items such as awnings or shade sails to avoid the harsh morning and afternoon sun.

Maximise natural ventilation

- Take advantage of cooler mornings and evenings by switching off your air conditioner and opening windows and doors to let fresh air circulate.

Harness the power of the sun

- Switch to drying clothes on the line or a clothes rack.
- Consider installing solar panels and switch to running large appliances during the day to take advantage of the free energy.

Use appliances efficiently

- Use fans first – they're cheap to run at only around 2 cents per hour.
- If you're running an air conditioner, close internal doors to cool only the areas you need.
- Set your air-conditioning thermostat to the warmest setting that still achieves comfort – each degree cooler could add up to 10% to your electricity costs.

Conduct a home energy audit

- Learn how efficiently your household appliances are working and what changes you could make to lower your energy bills. DIY energy audit kits are available to borrow free from the City's libraries.



TREE-MENDOUS WINTER

PLANTING SEASON



The City's 2025 winter planting season has added more than 3,200 trees across our suburbs.

This is a combination of our annual planting program, along with requests and replacements.

The City operates several planting programs, aimed at increasing the overall urban canopy across City-controlled land.


This year, we planted 345 street trees from resident requests and gave away 380 trees as part of our All About Trees events for residents to plant at their homes.

The City's Urban Infill Program targets areas that are identified as having low canopy coverage. This year, the program focused on areas within Morley.

MOSQUITO MANAGEMENT IN THE CITY



The City's dedicated Mosquito Control Unit undertakes regular monitoring and treatment of mosquito breeding sites every year during the warmer months. Many of the known breeding sites are wetland areas next to the Swan River.

At times of heavy rain, these areas can become inundated and subject to tidal flushing. This, combined with higher temperatures, can result in increased mosquito breeding.

The City works closely with neighbouring local governments and the WA Department of Health to target breeding sites outside the City's boundaries to help reduce the impact on our residents.

BUZZ OFF!



Help reduce mosquitoes by taking the below steps to remove breeding habitats around your home.

Prevent breeding around your house

- Remove stagnant water sources, such as pot plant trays, cans, bottles and containers, and unblock gutters
- Stock your fishpond with mosquito larvae-feeding fish
- Maintain your swimming pool regularly and ensure it has clean, chlorinated water and is free from dead leaves

Protect your home

- Place fly wire on all doors and windows and around rainwater tank inlets and overflows
- Make sure lids are sealed on septic tanks, soak wells and leach drains
- Cut back foliage that can provide a home for mosquitoes

Personal protection

- Avoid exposure at dusk and dawn
- Wear loose-fitting, long clothing when outdoors
- Use a personal insect repellent


Is your pool summer ready?

Before breaking out the bathers this summer, it's important to check your pool or spa is safe and that its fence meets Australian safety standards.

Pool and spa safety checklist

- ✓ Your gate must open outward from the pool and be self-closing and self-latching.
- ✓ If your pool or spa is more than 300mm of water in depth, it must have a compliant safety barrier. This includes blow-up pools and above ground pools.
- ✓ The gate latch must be higher than 1.5m from the ground.
- ✓ Fencing needs to be at least 1.2m high with a gap no greater than 100mm from the ground.

The City carries out safety barrier inspections to ensure pools and spas meet Australian standards. To arrange an inspection, contact the City's Pool Compliance Officers on **9272 0622**.



Get bushfire ready

Between 1 November and 31 March, residents and landowners must ensure firebreaks are cleared and maintained to help protect from bushfires.

The City's Community Safety team will carry out inspections throughout the firebreak period to ensure properties are compliant and fire safe.

In both weeks, all three bins – general waste, recycling and FOGO – will be collected on your bin day.


