FAQ's

When can I apply?

Applications for Better Bayswater grants are available twice a year, in March and October.

How does Better Bayswater work?

The City values and strives to provide opportunities to partner with the community to deliver positive community outcomes which are consistent with, and complement, the City's strategic vision. The City encourages and supports the Better Bayswater grant funding to innovatively respond to social disadvantage, protection of the natural or built environment, partnerships, community development and capacity building.

The City provides two rounds of Better Bayswater grant funding per year. Grant applicants can apply for up to a maximum of \$5,000 for their project, subject to applicants matching a minimum of 50% of the project funds.

Can I apply more than once in a year?

Funds are only available to an organisation once per financial year across all grant funding categories. If your group has already received funding this year they cannot apply until next calendar year for more funding.

If I have received previous funding from the City do I need to do anything different?

If you have previously applied for funding for the City you will now need to use the new application forms and understand the new processes that apply. These can be found on the City's website, from City libraries or by contacting the relevant person on the numbers listed below.

How long does it take to get a decision?

Using new assessment and decision making criteria, funding decisions can usually be made within one month (20 working days) from the close of applications.

Where do I find the application forms and handbook?

If you have previously applied for funding for the City you will need to use the new application forms and understand the new processes that now apply. These can be found on the City's website, from City libraries or by contacting the relevant person on the numbers listed below.

If we are not incorporated will that be a problem?
