## Australian Bureau of Statistics Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SEIFA)



This document is an additional tool prepared by for the community's reference. It provides additional information on each of the City of Bayswater suburbs.

SEIFA or Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas, is an Australian Bureau of Statistics product that ranks areas in Australia according to relative socio-economic advantage and disadvantage. The Index of Relative Socio-Economic Advantage and Disadvantage (IRSAD) has been used in the City's suburb profiling, which summarises information about the economic and social conditions of people and households within an area.

A lower average score indicates a relatively high rate of disadvantage, such as many families with low income, low qualifications and people in low skilled occupations. A higher average score indicates a relative low rate of disadvantage, such as few households with low incomes, no qualifications or people in low skilled occupations.

- Areas with a Lower Average Socio-Economic Index: 1-5
- Areas with a Higher Average Socio-Economic Index: 6-10
