Introduction

Purpose

This Guideline has been prepared by Josh Byrne & Associates (JBA) on behalf of the City of Bayswater (the City). It provides a practical and flexible planting guide which will be used to inform future tree planting proposals and works across a range of urban typologies and conditions within the City.

This document is the first step in establishing a consistent approach to tree planting, considering both local environmental and amenity values. The guide has been prepared in two parts.

The first part documents approved trees species for streets with and without power lines. It includes detailed information such as tree descriptions, silhouettes of the mature form and images capturing the key features of the species. The intent of this information is to assist the City, as well as local residents, to make informed decisions regarding tree planting.

The second part documents approved trees for parks and gardens in the City of Bayswater. Less information has been provided for each of these species as it is primarily intended for the use of the City’s experienced Park Services team.

The Guideline is based on general observations of existing areas within the City.

It is essential when planting trees that consideration is given to the Main Roads Safety standards:

Selection Principles

The City’s preferred tree species have been selected according to their ability to thrive in the local soils and environmental conditions. A balance between native and exotic trees is necessary to provide a sustainable urban canopy which can cope with the difficult conditions within the streetscape environment.
















Tree selections are based on the following considerations:

- **Urban Typology** – Trees have been selected and categorised based on their suitability to Bayswater streetscapes and parks. The street tree species have been further divided according to height and therefore their appropriateness for streets with power lines.
- **Form and Function** – Trees are selected based on the local environmental context to enhance the unique character of the local area. Some of the critical selection considerations will be soil type, water requirements, root behaviour, plant height, width, form and colour; also, the creation of shade and consideration of pedestrian and vehicle sightlines.
- **Biodiversity** – The trees will support biodiversity and includes species which will benefit a range of fauna including birds, reptiles and insects.
- **Ongoing Success** – Tree species that require less maintenance and also consider maintenance implications, particularly concerning the safety of council workers or contractors maintaining trees in road reserves.
