

Waste and Recycling Guide 2025/26



The contents of your FOGO bin will be **composted**.



The contents of your recycling bin will be recycled into **new material**.



The contents of your general waste bin will go to **landfill**.



Using your FOGO kitchen caddy

- 

1 Line your FOGO caddy with your certified compostable liner.
- 

2 Place all your food scraps in the caddy and other compostable material like coffee grounds.
- 

3 After 2 - 3 days, or when the liner is full, put it in your FOGO bin. Food scraps can also be placed loosely in the bin.



Only use caddy liners that are certified compostable under Australian standards.



Compostable liners

The City provides rolls of certified compostable FOGO liners free of charge. You can collect liners from one of the City's libraries or the Civic Centre at 61 Broun Avenue, Morley. Please bring identification that shows your address.

You can also purchase compostable liners from supermarkets and hardware stores. Look for the seedling symbol on the packaging, which means it is compostable under Australian Standards.

Get sorted

Food Organics Garden Organics - Weekly

If it didn't live or grow, it's not FOGO. If in doubt, leave it out!

Place these items in your lime-green lid FOGO bin:

- ✓ Certified compostable caddy liners
- ✓ Food scraps, including meat, seafood, bones and shells
- ✓ Bread and dairy
- ✓ Tea leaves and coffee grounds
- ✓ Prunings (up to 30cm), lawn clippings, leaves and weeds

Do not place these items in your lime-green lid FOGO bin:

- ✗ No plastic bags
- ✗ No aerosol cans or gas bottles
- ✗ No batteries or electronic waste
- ✗ No clothes or textiles
- ✗ No glass
- ✗ No metal
- ✗ No nappies
- ✗ No coffee pods
- ✗ No kitty litter
- ✗ No takeaway cups or compostable packaging



Collect liners from a City of Bayswater Library, or the City of Bayswater Civic Centre.

Get sorted

Recycling - Fortnightly

Please don't bag your recyclables. Place all items loose into the bin. Please remove lids, and rinse all jars, cans, bottles and containers.

Place these items in your yellow lid recycling bin:

- ✓ Glass bottles and jars
- rinsed and lids removed
- ✓ Paper - not shredded
(including newspaper and magazines)
- ✓ Cardboard - flattened
- ✓ Plastic bottles and containers -
clean, empty and no lids
- ✓ Steel and aluminium cans - clean
and empty

Do not place these items in your yellow lid recycling bin:

- ✗ No aerosol cans or gas bottles
- ✗ No batteries or electronic waste
- ✗ No clothes or textiles
- ✗ No materials in plastic bags
- ✗ No nappies, hygiene or sanitary products
- ✗ No soft plastics (e.g. plastic bags and wrappers)
- ✗ No ropes, cables or hose
- ✗ No UHT (long-life/silver lined) cartons
- ✗ No takeaway cups



The contents of your recycling bin will be recycled into **new material**.

Get sorted

General waste - Fortnightly

Your red lid general waste bin is for items that can't be composted or recycled.

Place these items in your red lid general waste bin:

- ✓ Soft scrunchable plastics
- ✓ Hygiene and sanitary products
- ✓ Nappies
- ✓ Polystyrene and soft plastic
- ✓ Coffee pods
- ✓ UHT (long-life/silver lined) cartons
- ✓ Clothing and textiles
- ✓ Meat trays
- ✓ Kitty Litter
- ✓ Takeaway cups and packaging

Do not place these items in your red lid general waste bin:

- ✗ No food organics or garden organics
- ✗ No clean recyclables
- ✗ No hazardous waste like aerosols, light globes or batteries
- ✗ No hot ashes or liquids
- ✗ No sand or soil
- ✗ No construction, demolition or building materials



The contents of your general waste bin will go to **landfill**.

Bulk Waste

The City of Bayswater provides three bulk bins to residential properties each financial year. For more information or to book a bulk bin, visit bayswater.wa.gov.au/bulkbin or call **9272 0622**.

Not enough space on your verge? Contact the City to make alternative arrangements.

Blue bulk bin



General waste

- ✓ Bulky household items, dismantled furniture, timber and toys.

Do not place these items in your blue bulk bin:

- ✗ No building material
- ✗ No asbestos
- ✗ No mattresses or white goods
- ✗ No hazardous items like chemicals, batteries or paint
- ✗ No liquids
- ✗ No car parts including tyres
- ✗ No electronic waste

Green bulk bin



Green waste

- ✓ Grass clippings, leaves and branches (up to 1.5m long and 15cm wide).

Do not place these items in your green bulk bin:

- ✗ No household items like furniture, mattresses or white goods
- ✗ No sand or lawn sods
- ✗ No treated timber or sleepers
- ✗ No plastic or recyclables
- ✗ No building material or asbestos
- ✗ No liquids
- ✗ No pet waste



All bulk bins

Only fill to the top of your bin.

Carefully read the list of allowable contents as charges may apply for disposal of items not permitted.

Do not shift the bin from the place where it is delivered and keep the area around it clear.

Mattresses and white goods

Request up to two mattress or white goods home collections per year.

Baywaste Transfer Station and Recycling Centre

The City is no longer using tip passes to access Baywaste Transfer Station and Recycling Centre. To use the site to drop off materials, residents must show proof of residency in the City of Bayswater. All visitors must provide ID. Photo ID including an address, such as a driver's licence, will be accepted. This service is only for residential properties. Any commercial loads will be subject to the site's fees and charges.

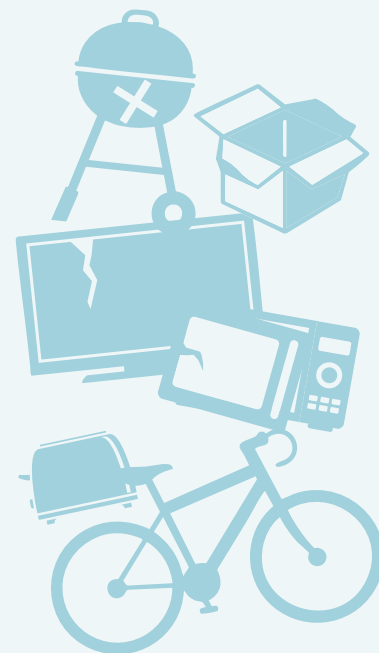

- E-waste
- Scrap metal
- Cardboard
- Bicycles

Household hazardous waste

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) can contain chemicals or substances harmful to people and the environment and should not be placed in any household bin.

Examples include:



Gas cylinders & aerosols



Batteries



Flammables



Corrosives



Pesticides & herbicides



Poisons



Fire extinguishers (non-halon)



Paint and solvents



Fluorescent lights

These items can be dropped off for free at a permanent HHW facility. Limit of 20kg or 20L per material type per day. For more information and drop off points, visit wastenet.net.au/hhw

Batteries and light globes

Household batteries and light globes contain non-renewable and potentially harmful materials and are not safe to place in your kerbside rubbish bins. Recycle them at one of the City's recycling stations:

- Bayswater Waves
- City of Bayswater Civic Centre
- The RISE
- Morley Sport and Recreational Centre
- Bayswater Library

Batteries can also be recycled at registered B-cycle drop off points located at major supermarkets and hardware stores. Visit bcycle.com.au for all locations
