Item 10.3.1 Traffic Speed Environment in Bath Road, Morley			
QUESTION(S)	RESPONSE / ACTION

1. A submission was made to Main Roads to reduce the speed limit on Bath road down to 50km an hour and I believe we did the traffic study to support that and the Officers made a submission to Main Roads- can the City give a bit of detail about that submission and what type of things the City spoke about in support of the reduction to 50km an hour?	Submissions seeking a speed zone change are made via a standard proforma to Main Roads WA. The consists of information regarding the road, traffic classification data (traffic counts, classes and speeds) and other information that supports the request. The following information is in support of this particular application:		
	<ul> <li>The traffic data collected in addition to the previous traffic data collected along Bath Road indicated that a significant proportion of vehicles are already travelling at or below a speed of 50km/h. (ie the current operating speed is already in line with a 50km/h regulatory speed limit).</li> <li>The road is in close proximity to the Hampton Park Primary School which is located north of Morley Drive and Weld Square Primary School which is located approximately 390m west of Bath Road. No other non-residential major generators are in place along or in close proximity to the road section under consideration.</li> <li>The road currently has a number of Local Area Traffic Management series of measures in place.</li> <li>A review undertaken for the road has indicated that, under the Safe Systems Approach as outlined in the Speed Zoning Policy and Application Guidelines, the benefits associated with a lowering of the speed limit in this location would provide safety benefits to both users of the road and the local community including pedestrians and cyclists with minimal impact on vehicular traffic.</li> <li>Lowering of the speed limit may not have detrimental impact due to the entire frontage along the section of road being residential.</li> <li>It is not anticipated to be any measurable impacts to traffic operations along the road relating to queuing and vehicle delays with the change in speed zoning as it resulted only an additional 5s in travel time.</li> </ul>
