New Mayor leads City of Bayswater Council

The City elected its first-ever female Mayor, Filomena Piffaretti, at a Special Council Meeting on Monday 18 October, following the 2021 Local Government Elections.

At the meeting, Councillors also voted Catherine Ehrhardt as the new Deputy Mayor.

New Councillors Josh Eveson for North Ward and Assunta Meleca for Central Ward, and re-elected Councillors Elli Petersen-Pik, Lorna Clarke, Giorgia Johnson and Mayor Piffaretti were officially sworn in at the meeting.

These Councillors have each been elected for a four year term, up to 2025.

Morley Sport and Recreation Centre ready for action

Stage one of the Morley Sport and Recreation Centre redevelopment is open and ready for the community to enjoy.

With a new sports hall featuring additional basketball, netball and badminton courts, the Morley Sport and Recreation Centre is now a premier facility with courts designed to host the East Perth Eagles in the State Basketball league, as well as a range of local sporting clubs and community activities.

Accessible change rooms and toilets form part of the redevelopment, and sports match floodlighting has been installed on Pat O' Hara Reserve.

The redevelopment was made possible because of support from Member for Morley, the Hon Amber-Jade Sanderson BA MLA, Minister for Environment, Climate Action and Commerce through a \$2million Community Sport and Recreation Facility grant from the Department of Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries, and the City's stimulus package.

Take a dip at the refurbished Bayswater Waves

The refurbishment of the 25 metre lap pool, pool hall, outdoor change rooms and plant room at Bayswater Waves should be finished by the end of the year - so get ready to make a splash this summer!

Sustainability upgrades include the installation of solar panels; and accessibility improvements include the reconfiguration of the waterslide and creation of pathways to allow for wheelchair and pram access, the upgrade of the adult change rooms, and remodeling of the entry gate and accessibility ramps.

City on track to be fully powered by renewable energy

In October, Council voted to enter into a contract with Synergy to transition its electricity supply to renewable sources, paving the way for it to become the State's first local government to be fully powered by WA sourced renewable energy.

Under the new three year contract, the City will reduce its emissions by 53% and save approximately \$400,000.

From April 2022, the City's electricity will be sourced from WA wind farms. The new contract will allow the City to reach its target of 100% renewable electricity for City operations, excluding Western Power street lighting by 2022 – three years earlier than planned.

The City's switch to renewable energy is part of its Emissions Reduction and Renewable Energy Plan and aims to mitigate the effects of climate change at a local level.

Hang out at the new outdoor space at The RISE

The outdoor space near The RISE in Maylands has been transformed into a vibrant community precinct, based on feedback from our community. The area features a small stage, furniture, giant games, festoon lighting, tree planting and signage.

Our community came out in force to celebrate the official opening and we look forward to it being a place where people can be entertained, relax and have some fun with friends and family.

Maylands Waterland

Work is progressing at the Maylands Waterland redevelopment, including the completion of the external pathway around the southern section; native planting along the riverbank; site preparation and groundworks; splash pad foundations and connecting pipework; and concrete formwork for accessibility ramps and staircases.

Unfortunately, onsite progress has been held up by greater than expected rain events over winter and spring, as well as the impact COVID-19 has had on the global supply chain and labour availability in Western Australia.

Rest assured works are progressing. We are anticipating opening the main parkland to the public in April 2022 – and we know it will be worth the wait!



Mural pays homage to our four-legged friends

More than 90 dog portraits of our local four-legged friends will feature on the refurbished toilet block at popular dog exercise spot, Riverside Gardens.

The mural by Perth caricature artist, Rick Adams, will transform an ordinary toilet block into an eye-catching building that celebrates our best friends.

The renovations to the toilet block will also include the reconfiguration of the family change room to include two Universal Accessible Toilets and the refurbishment of the existing toilets, baby change stations, slip resistant tiling and sensor LED lighting.

All this makes Riverside Gardens a more accessible location for our community to enjoy – and is thanks to a grant from the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

Dogs and people welcome here

In our community, everyone is welcome - including our furry friends.




