Help green the City by transforming your verge into a waterwise wonderland that benefits both you and your neighbourhood.

Winter is a great time to refresh your verge, with cooler weather and plenty of rain to help new plants establish and thrive.

For residential verges, we encourage everyone to play their part in keeping these shared spaces neat, safe and easy for all to enjoy.

The following verge treatments are welcome and don't require any approvals provided they don't block sightlines or pedestrian access.

- ✓ Natural lawn
- ✓ Gardens with native, waterwise or edible plants
- ✓ Low-growing plants, shrubs and groundcovers
- ✓ Natural elements such as woodchips, rocks or logs
- ✓ Raised garden beds (up to 0.35m)
- ✓ Up to 30% brick paving

The following treatments are not permitted:

- ✗ Artificial lawn
- ✗ Stakes, ropes or sharp objects that may present a hazard
- ✗ More than 30% hardstand (requires approval)

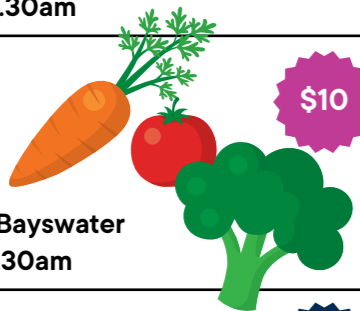

Keep warm for less

Follow these quick and easy tips to save energy and money this winter.

Heat smarter

- Layer up. Embrace your fluffy socks and dressing gown, and use blankets and rugs before switching on the heater.
- Heat only the rooms you need to and close doors to rooms you're not using.
- Set your thermostat to the coolest setting that still achieves comfort – each degree warmer could add up to 10% to your electricity costs.

Keep the heat in

- Open curtains and blinds on windows during the day to allow the sun to naturally warm your home, then close them as the temperature drops in the evening to keep heat in.
- Seal draughts by using door snakes and weather-stripping windows.

Conduct a home energy audit

- Learn how efficiently your household appliances are working and what changes you could make to lower your energy bills. DIY energy audit kits are available to borrow free from the City's libraries.

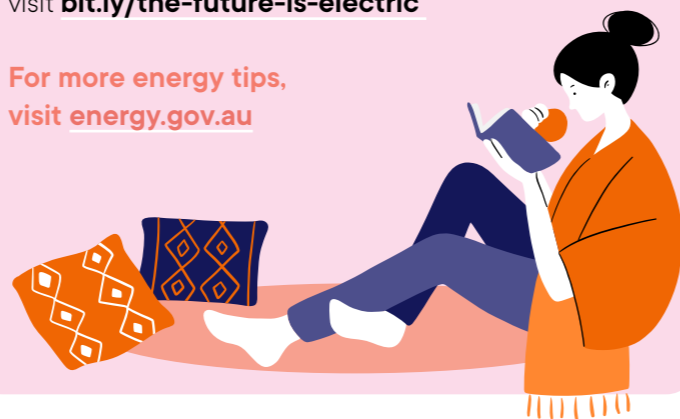

Is your home winter-ready?

Winter safety starts at home. Taking a few simple precautions now can help keep your home and the community safe.

- Test smoke alarms and replace batteries
- Keep heaters at least one metre from furniture and curtains
- Avoid overloading power boards
- Turn off heaters when leaving the house or going to bed
- Clear leaves and debris from gutters and drains
- Secure loose outdoor furniture
- Trim tree branches
- Check fences and structures after storms

To help keep our streets safe, ensure:

- Vehicles are not blocking footpaths
- Trees and vegetation do not block sightlines
- House numbers are clearly visible for emergency services



Heading on holidays? Let us know

If you're heading away over winter, give our Community Safety team a call before you go.

We can add your street to our 24/7 security patrol to provide a visible presence and keep an eye out for suspicious behaviour while you're away.

If the weather gets wild, it's important to know who to call to respond in an emergency.

For life-threatening emergencies.

For help with storm damage, flooding and fallen trees affecting your property.

Call the 24-hour emergency line to report a hazard or fault caused by damage to overhead power lines, power poles and other power equipment.

Water Corporation – 13 13 75

Report a fault or emergency such as water outage, burst water main, wastewater overflow or damaged drainage pipelines.

Report storm damage impacting footpaths, roads, parks and public infrastructure in the City of Bayswater.
