Purpose

This policy states the Council's position on private dinghy storage on river foreshore reserves, under its care and control.

Scope

This policy applies to community members who wish to store watercraft on foreshore areas within the City of Bayswater.

Definitions

- Long term storage means storage on the river for longer than 24 hours
- Short term storage means storage on the river less than 24 hours
- Dinghy means a single hull watercraft no longer than 3.5m in length
- Small watercraft means other craft approved by the Chief Executive Officer

Policy Statement

In order to meet the City of Bayswater's obligations in respect to the Swan River Trust Dinghy Management Policy (SRT/D26), the City of Bayswater adopts the following policy:

- 1. Long term storage of dinghies on land managed by the City of Bayswater, can only occur in areas designated by the City as a 'formal storage site'.
- 2. The formal storage sites in the City of Bayswater currently includes Tranby Reserve, south-east of the Maylands Amateur Boat Building Yard.
- 3. The storage area will include bollards which have an identification number and chain.
- 4. The storage approach is designed for management purposes. The City of Bayswater is not responsible for the security of the watercraft.
- 5. Private dinghies, and other small, approved watercraft, can be stored for a 12-monthly period once registered with the City of Bayswater.
- 6. Owners can apply to renew their storage registration each year.

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- 7. The administration fee for this service is as outlined in the City of Bayswater's Schedule of Fees and Charges.
- 8. A lock will need to be supplied by the owner to secure the Dinghy and a spare key to the lock given to the City of Bayswater upon approved registration.
- 9. Storage is available only for boat owners with long term river moorings.
- 10. Availability is limited and issued on a first come first served basis.
- 11. If a dinghy is damaged or in poor condition the City may request the owner to make the Dinghy good or remove the Dinghy.
- 12. The long-term storage of private dinghies, and other watercraft, stored on any other foreshore within the City of Bayswater is prohibited and will result in removal.
- 13. This policy took effect 1 October 2015; as such, unregistered dinghies can be removed as required.
- 14. Removal of unregistered private dinghies, and other watercraft, can be managed by the City of Bayswater through liaison with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA).
- 15. Failure to comply with the Policy or Management Practice can result in the City of Bayswater cancelling a dinghy owner's registration.

Related Legislation

The City of Bayswater's foreshore reserves are subject to the jurisdictional powers of the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) as set out by the *Swan and Canning Rivers Management Act 2006*.
